D. <u>Basic Position</u>

The Companies have appropriately calculated their true-up amounts and purchased gas adjustment factor as shown in the Companies' joint positions on Issues 1-6 and ask that the Commission approve the Companies' proposed consolidated PGA Factor for 2026.

E. –G <u>Issues</u>

The Companies' positions on the issues identified for hearing are as follows:

Issue 1: What are the final purchased gas adjustment true-up amounts for the period

January 2024 through December 2024?

Companies: For the period January 2024 through December 2024, the Companies had an

under-recovery of \$729,664 inclusive of interest.

<u>Issue 2:</u> What are the actual/estimated purchased gas adjustment true-up amounts for

the period January 2025 through December 2025?

Companies: The actual/estimated true up amount for 2025 is an expected over-recovery

of \$1,318,472 inclusive of interest.

<u>Issue 3:</u> What are the total purchased gas adjustment true-up amounts to be collected

(refunded) during the period January 2026 through December 2026?

Companies: In total, the Companies have calculated an over-recovery of \$588,808, to be

refunded during the projected period.

<u>Issue 4:</u> What are the levelized purchased gas adjustment cost recovery (cap) factors

(\$0.00000 per therm) for the period January 2026 through December 2026?

Companies: The appropriate PGA factor is 127.69¢ per therm.

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<u>Issue 5:</u> What should be the effective date of the new purchased gas adjustment

charge for billing purposes?

<u>Companies:</u> The factor should be effective beginning with the specified cost recovery

cycle and thereafter for the period January 2026 through December 2026.

Billing cycles may start before January 1, 2026 and the last cycle may be

read after December 31, 2026, so that each customer is billed for twelve

months regardless of when the adjustment factor became effective.

<u>Issue 6:</u> Should the Commission approve revised tariffs reflecting the new

purchased gas adjustment cost recovery factors (\$0.0000 per therm)

determined to be appropriate in this proceeding?

Companies: Yes. The Commission should approve revised tariffs reflecting the new

purchased gas adjustment charges determined to be appropriate in this

proceeding. The Commission should direct staff to verify that the revised

tariffs are consistent with the Commission's decision.

<u>Issue 7</u>: Should this docket be closed?

Companies: This is a continuing cost recovery docket and should remain an active and

ongoing proceeding. As such, a new docket number should be established

annually to reflect the new calendar year.

G. Stipulated Issues

While not a party to stipulations at this time, the Companies believe that it should be

possible to reach a stipulation on each of the issues as they pertain to FPUC and FCG.

H. Pending Motions

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None at this time.

J. <u>Compliance With Order on Procedure</u>

Florida Public Utilities Company and Florida City Gas have fully complied with the requirements of Order No. PSC-2025-0050-PCO-GU, issued on February 10, 2025.
