Dear Counsel

I would like to formally protest the proposed increase in our water costs in the Water Oak Country Club community that is owned by Sun Communities. This community is a 55 and older park with many of us on fixed incomes. I request that this letter be counted as a formal written objection to such an outrageous rate hike. In all my life, I have not seen such an increase in any utility.

Protest Objections: This rate increase could cause harm to an already stretched budget and could put my wife and I in financial harm. Such a large increase could drive residents to decide between other crucial expenses. As I am sure, the counsel is aware that Medicare does not pay all medical expenses that may be needed in the elderly sector.

Justification: I am not sure of the justification for such a large increase. I have not seen or heard of any changes or improvements to the water system. The increase could be as much as 300 to 400%, and I cannot believe that a complete overhaul of the system could be that much given the amount of residents in the park.

I believe it would be in the public service commission's best interest to investigate why this is happening to our residents. As indicated earlier, please include my objection to such an egregious request for an increase without any legitimate reason for such a step, other than to increase their profits.
