I am writing to express our concerns regarding the proposed water changes (Docket#20250108-WS) and the potential long term impact on residents and infrastructure in our community of Sunlake Estates.

We respectfully ask that these concerns be fully considered before any approval is granted.

A potential rate increase of 78%-190% cannot be justified.

Water main breaks are a frequent occurrence in Sunlake and are detrimental to our health and wellbeing. There were 23 water main breaks in 2023; 29 breaks in 2024 and 15 breaks in 2025. Not everyone has the ability to access bottled water as many do not drive.

This brings up another point, which is affordability. Many of us have chosen a manufactured community as it offers an affordable living situation as most of us are on a fixed income.

This proposed increase may seem inconsequential to you, but it will have a great impact on the seniors who exist on a tight budget and may have to endure the overwhelming stress of selling their home in order to find a more affordable living situation.
