PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN BROWN: So we are calling this

Internal Affairs meeting to order. The time is 11:38,

and today is Tuesday, April 4th. And we are going to

start out with -- it's a very short one. I don't

anticipate this going long, maybe five, ten minutes. So

we'll start out with legislative affairs update

MR. HINTON: It will go very fast. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you.

MR. HINTON: Before I hand it off to Katherine and Adam to discuss the schedule and update you on any status, I wanted to just bring your attention to one bill I'm sure you've already heard about. But since it was proposed since our last Internal Affairs, I just wanted to draw some attention to it.

House Bill 7071 began as a proposed House

Committee bill from the House Energy and Utility

Subcommittee. It amends several statutes that affect

the Commission and our statutory authority. In

particular, it amends Chapter 120 to eliminate the

Commission's exemption on rulemaking for cost recovery

clauses. It amends Chapter 350 where it addresses the

Nominating Council, Commissioner appointments, and terms

of office. It also moves the Office of Public Counsel

from the legislature to the Attorney General's Office,

and it also -- and it requires the Commission to conduct
annual service hearings in the service territory of each
IOU.

Further, the bill would amend Chapter 366 to
require the Commission to establish four IOUs'

require the Commission to establish four IOUs'
utility-specific performance criteria that will be
evaluated annually, maximum generation reserve margins
of 15 percent, and multiyear rate plans very similar to
the settlements that the Commission has approved in
recent rate cases.

That's the bill in a nutshell. I'd be happy to handle -- address any questions. We did -- it did go before the House Government Operations and Technology Appropriations Committee this morning where it was passed out favorably. And so --

CHAIRMAN BROWN: What was the vote?

MR. HINTON: Sorry?

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Vote?

MR. HINTON: Yes. It was voted --

CHAIRMAN BROWN: What was the vote, sir?

MR. HINTON: 11-to-2. I didn't know how many yays there were, but I knew there was two no's. And the next step is Commerce Committee.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Okay. More importantly, there is a Senate resolution commemorating Commissioner

Patronis's family and 50 years of Captain Anderson's. 1 COMMISSIONER PATRONIS: How did you hear that? 2 CHAIRMAN BROWN: A little birdie told me about 3 it. And I just wanted to recognize Commissioner 4 Patronis for -- and his family for the years that you've 5 spent -- 50 years at Captain Anderson's. And I know 6 7 that there's a lot of support surrounding that, so I wanted to congratulate you. 8 9 COMMISSIONER PATRONIS: Thank you, Madam Chair. 10 CHAIRMAN BROWN: All right. Commissioners, 11 any questions on the Senate or House side? 12 Commissioners? Commissioner Polmann? No? 13 14 Commissioner Brisé. COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: I can't -- I haven't been 15 following this very closely, but is this the bill that 16 17 also creates districts? 18 MR. HINTON: Yeah. That's part of the amendments to Chapter 350. Future Commissioners would 19 have to be appointed from one of the five districts that 20 21 match the District Courts of Appeal. 22 COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Sure. Have they 23 gotten -- has there been discussion on how structurally that would be in terms of would there be district 24

offices? Would there be intention for district staff

and all of that? Has there been any discussion?

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Ms. Pennington.

MS. PENNINGTON: Thank you, ma'am. They've really not, Commissioner Brisé. We have some question about that as our legal staff is interpreting it to believe that there may be a need and a requirement for an office within your district.

House staff seems to say that's not necessarily the case, but they're -- and then there is still a requirement in 350 that the office -- your offices be in Tallahassee, and that has not been touched by the proposed legislation. So it's still a little in flux. We have had discussions. We've given them some fiscal information based upon our interpretation, which is you would have, you would have your district office, I guess.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Sure.

MR. HINTON: The plain language states that to be appointed you have to reside there, but it's silent about whether you have to continue to reside there, so.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Okay. Commissioners, any follow-up?

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Yeah. I mean, rationally one would think that if you want me to be appointed from the region, there's a reason why you want me to be

appointed from there. So you want me to have some 1 connect, and it would make sense that I would reside 2 there so that I could have a sense of -- not the 3 constituency, but what the needs and the interests are 4 5 of those who live in the area that, that the Commissioner is coming from. Not that the Commission 6 7 would represent the area, but that there would be some, some level of connection that would exist. 8 9 CHAIRMAN BROWN: That's logical. That makes 10 logical sense. MR. BAEZ: Commissioner, I think the bill 11 analysis kind of teed up the question as softly as we 12 could, and there may be conversation about that or not, 13 14 but that's --CHAIRMAN BROWN: So I promised a short 15 16 agenda -- I mean, Internal Affairs, so -- and we have 17 two more lights. So I'm going to kind of ask the Commissioners to kind of streamline this. 18 19 Commissioner Patronis. 2.0 COMMISSIONER PATRONIS: The summary you gave 21 us is over the House bill. What is the status of the 22 Senate bill?

MS. PENNINGTON: No, sir.

It doesn't -- there's no other legislative affairs, but we're going to General Counsel. 10 I do also want to acknowledge, Mr. Kiser, it's 11 12 nice to see you in the room. We're all curious: "What is he doing here? What's going on?" We're happy to --13 14 hotdogs. We're very happy to -- we're happy to see you. I look forward to chatting up with you after we break 15 16 now. 17 General Counsel. 18 MR. HETRICK: Just one announcement, Madam 19 Chair. Lee Eng Tan has been appointed to succeed Keino, and he'll be -- she'll be assuming her responsibilities 20 21 on April 10th. 22 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Wonderful. Wonderful. 23 will miss Keino, but that's a great selection. 24 And Executive Director. 25 MR. BAEZ: Thank you, Madam Chair. Real

quickly, the budgets, the proposed budgets for -- have emanated from both houses. And so if you recall, our LBR was pretty straightforward. We were proposing to absorb the general revenue portion of our budget and the three positions that were attached to it into our trust-funded budget. And we also had an item to replace some aging vehicles and then some technical issues for our relationship with the State Technology Office.

The House issued their proposed budget for the agency. They were proposing a 16-position reduction, along with an 815,000 reduction in the appropriation related to it. The Senate, on the other hand, proposed only a reduction of four positions and a corresponding 204,000 reduction in the appropriation. Both houses —both sides picked up all of our issues, though, so that's a good starting point. To be continued. Now we're waiting for all the steps in conference, so.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you, and thank you also for keeping us informed on that process too.

MR. BAEZ: We'll continue to keep you posted.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Okay. Other matters. I just have one. Although he's not here because he's working diligently for the Commission and doing -- conducting an audit, Carl Vinson with our audit -- is our April 2017 employee of the month. And he's been an employee since

1989. He will not get shortchanged on his recognition, and we'll enjoy all that goes with that. And we'll be presenting it to him later this month, his award. But he's just a tremendous employee, has been with the Office of Auditing and Performance Analysis. All of us have gotten a chance to know him, and I'm really excited that he gets the honor this month as employee of the month.

He also enjoys duck hunting, I did not know that about him, and has a granddaughter that he just treasures. So, please, when you see Carl, you know, congratulate him for all the work and effort. He's got a great deal of support here in the Commission.

If there are no other matters -- seeing none, this Internal Affairs meeting is adjourned. Thank you. (Proceeding adjourned at 11:47 a.m.)
