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2. CHAIRMAN FAY: All right, Commissioners. This is our internal affairs meeting for May 17th. Ι would like to start, like I do most of our meetings, recognizing the Employee of the Month for April, and that is Margarita. Margarita has been with our agency since about 2019, and she's a point-person for processing all of the Lifeline letters that go out to qualified recipients. And I think that in itself is an amazing challenge, and so she does a great job with that.

> With that said, with the help of her team and coworkers, they send out about 28,000 letter --Lifeline letters in the past four months, which is more than the last four years combined. And so I think that just -- it's a testament to the workload and what an amazing job she's done. Her team absolutely loves her and loves to be -- loves having her in the agency. In addition to all of those letters, she also does assisted for customers and certification applications and other Lifeline She takes great pride in her work. services. Ι enjoyed speaking with her. And probably, most importantly, she does all of these things with a smile. She's just really a pleasure to speak with.

14	MR. BAEZ: Talk about passing. Thank you, Mr.
15	Chairman, and good morning, Commissioners. And I
16	wanted to tag on to your comments earlier. I
17	wanted to thank all the presentation, not just the
18	staff that put it together, but the folks that
19	presented today. The materials were full of real
20	good information. And, as you say, they are
21	available, they're going to get posted online for
22	all to see. And anyone that's listening at home, I
23	would recommend I would recommend the materials
24	because they do give a good walk-through and a
25	greater appreciation and understanding of exactly

what a resident is going through and what their utility is doing for them during the storm season and in the -- you know, in the aftermath of the storm, unfortunately.

You heard stuff -- you heard things that -one thing that jumped out at me was, you know, an
appreciation for the fact that supply chain issues
are a universal problem and that -- that just
highlights how many things, as we're all kind of
learning now, how many things are beyond our
collective control, certainly in utility regulation
and things like storm preparation and storm
recovery. So that was a good highlight. And also
the evolving use of these micro sites. And you can
see the sizing down to -- for faster response is
also a good evolution of the process.

And, lastly, the word of the -- the word of the day for me is Resistograph. I don't know who came up with that, but it's awesome. I wish I had had one as a child. It wouldn't have helped me any, but it may have made my life -- my parents' life a little bit easier. So that was -- that was the word of the day for me.

Real quick updates on the legislative front.

Thanks to Kaley here next to me, almost all of our

A bills, or the bills that were the top of our list to monitor, have been addressed already. There may be one that's lying out there, but no -- no real agency impact. It's just something that was -that was bumped up.

In addition, the staff continues to monitor for actions on any of the -- any Florida drawdown on the Federal Infrastructure Funding. No real news on that, but we're still collecting information and facts that we'll be able to flow back to you as it becomes relevant and necessary. Hopefully we'll have, you know, some kind of -- once the things settle, we'll have some -- a more complete presentation for you, kind of an update. So, to be continued.

And then real quick schedule-wise. You know they had a special session back in April, 19th through 22nd the legislature was in town and dealt with -- dealt with some issues. And then, as if to highlight yet another aspect of hurricane preparation, there's a second special session where the Governor has called on some potential changes to insurance -- on the insurance. You can see that storm preparation and hurricane season doesn't just -- you know, as much as we are concentrated on

our piece of the larger picture, it doesn't belong
to us exclusively. It drives -- it drives the
state and everything that the state does. So some
of that might involve certainly insurance issues,
but building code changes and what. We'll be -we'll be keeping an eye on that.

Looking down the calendar. This was a -you've got the ten-year site plan workshop scheduled for June 1st, a Commission workshop. then our next Internal Affairs is a great -- this was a great seque into our next Internal Affairs, where we're having a presentation by the Department of Emergency Management. So now you get to see the two sides of storm preparation, get to take a peek inside the emergency operations. As you know, Robert Graham mans ESF 12 for the Commission, along with the other representatives from the utilities, and they do their piece for coordination on storm recovery, et cetera. So it actually sets you up nicely to see the -- experience, you know, more of the process from another aspect.
