Commission approval is sought

Pursuant to Section 120.74(1), Florida Statutes (F.S.), the Commission must prepare a regulatory plan by October 1 of each year. The plan must include a listing of each law enacted or amended during the previous 12 months that creates or modifies the duties or authority of the agency. The Commission must also include a listing of each statute which the Commission expects to implement by rulemaking before July 1, 2022, and must include any update to the 2020 Regulatory Plan. The plan must also include a certification verifying that the persons executing the certification have reviewed the plan and that the agency regularly reviews its rules to determine consistency with the agency's rulemaking authority and the laws implemented.

Section 120.74(2), F.S., requires that by October 1 of each year, the regulatory plan must be published on the Commission's website and electronically delivered to the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee (JAPC). Also by October 1, the Commission must publish a notice in the Florida Administrative Register that gives the date the Regulatory Plan was published on the Commission's website.

In order to comply with the statutory October 1, 2021 deadline, staff is seeking Commission approval of the 2021 Regulatory Plan at the September 8, 2021 Internal Affairs. The transmittal letter to JAPC contains the certification required by Section 120.74(1)(d), F.S. The list of laws that create or modify the Commission's duties or authority is attached to the certification letter as Attachment A. Attachment B to the certification letter is the Commission's list of laws that it expects to implement through rule adoption, amendment, or repeal before July 1, 2022. The Commission's report that it has no laws or updates to the 2020 Regulatory Plan is Attachment C to the certification letter.

The Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) hereby files its 2021 Regulatory Plan pursuant to Section 120.74, Florida Statutes (F.S.).

Section 120.74(1)(a), F.S., requires a listing of each law enacted or amended during the previous 12 months which creates or modifies the duties or authority of the agency. For each law listed under paragraph (a), the plan must state whether rule adoption is required to implement the law, and if so, whether a notice of rule development has been published and the date by which the agency expects to publish the notice of proposed rule. The Commission's report of laws pursuant to Section 120.74(1)(a), F.S., is attached hereto as Attachment A.

Section 120.74(1)(b), F.S., states that the regulatory plan must also include a listing of each law not listed pursuant to Section 120.74(1)(a), F.S., that the agency expects to implement by rulemaking before the following July 1. For each law listed under paragraph (b), the plan must state whether the rulemaking is intended to simplify, clarify, increase efficiency, improve coordination with other agencies, reduce costs, or delete obsolete, unnecessary, or redundant rules. The Commission's report of laws pursuant to Section 120.74(1)(b), F.S., is attached hereto as Attachment B.

Section 120.74(1)(c), F.S., requires an identification and listing of laws that were previously identified in a prior year's regulatory plan as requiring rulemaking to implement, but for which a notice of proposed rule has not been published. The Commission has no laws or

3	We'll call the Internal Affairs meeting to order.
4	Same players, same hats, right?
5	All right. We're going to begin this morning
6	with the draft regulatory plan. Ms. Calgary, are
7	you going to present Ms. Cowdery I'm sorry
8	are you going to present that?
9	MS. COWDERY: Yes. Good morning,
10	Commissioners. Staff is seeking approval of the
11	Commission's 2021 regulatory plan reporting on
12	rulemaking for the upcoming year.
13	Section 120.74, Florida Statutes, requires the
14	Commission to prepare this regulatory plan and
15	submit the plan to the Joint Administrative
16	Procedures Committee by October 1st.
17	A certification certification by the
18	Chairman and the general counsel that they have
19	reviewed the plan and that the Commission regularly
20	reviews its rules for correctness is required.
21	The plan must be posted on the Commission
22	website and the certification submitted to the
23	Joint Administrative Procedures Committee by
24	October 1st.
25	We plan to work with the Chairman's office to

1	submit the certification letter to the Joint
2	Administrative Procedures Committee and ask for
3	administrative authority to correct any scrivener's
4	errors, as necessary, before posting.
5	Staff is available to answer any questions.
6	CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. Thank you,
7	Ms. Cowdery.
8	Commissioners, do you have any questions or
9	comments on the draft regulatory plan?
10	All right. We need a motion to approve.
11	COMMISSIONER FAY: Mr. Chairman, I move to
12	accept the report.
13	CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. Do I have a
14	second?
15	COMMISSIONER La ROSA: Second.
16	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Motion and a second.
17	Any discussion?

5	MR. BAEZ: Good morning, Chairman. Good
6	morning, Commissioners. I have three real quick
7	items for you today. Apropos of the rule plan, you
8	know that the regular session this past regular
9	session, Senate Bill 1944 was enacted related to
10	utility poles and and utility and
11	communications poles.
12	Part of the implementation of that legislation
13	became effective July 1st. And staff has held its
14	first rule shop rule workshop for rule
15	development this past Wednesday, September 1st.
16	A draft procedural rule concerning pole-
17	attachment complaints that's that's one-half
18	of of the bill of the substance of the
19	bill is was the subject of the discussion.
20	And we are awaiting comments from the interested
21	parties, which are due on September 15th.
22	That particular piece of the rulemaking is due
23	for proposal by January 1st of this coming year.
24	That to be clear, that's the part on pole-
25	attachment complaints.

1	Separately, the statute requires the
2	Commission to propose a rule for adoption by
3	April 1st of 2022, on pole inspections; that being
4	the vegetation management, et cetera, for pole
5	owners.
6	We have opened a docket it's Docket
7	No. 20210138 for this part of the rulemaking.
8	And we expect to issue a notice in in the coming
9	couple of weeks or so for a rule development
10	workshop concerning that portion of the
11	legislation.
12	Any questions
13	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Any questions
14	MR. BAEZ: before I move on?
15	No? Okay.
16	Second item up, just a reminder that, on
17	September 15th, the Agency will be filing its LBR
18	for the 2022-'23 fiscal year. We've been to visit
19	with each of you and read you the particulars.
20	Generally, it's a flat budget. We're not
21	we don't have we're not carrying any items
22	through the LBR. And just wanted to let you know
23	that we're we're it's in formatting and we're
24	ready to upload on September 15th.
25	If you have any questions thank you.

1	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Questions?
2	MR. BAEZ: Lastly, something I wanted to bring
3	to your attention on it's it's a legislative
4	issue as well. We were contacted I think it was
5	either last week or the week before by Senate
6	staff and inquiring or or they told us of
7	their intention to run up a proposed committee bill
8	and asked us to help them with cleaning up Life
9	the Lifeline statute. That's 364.10.
10	That this is language that we have proposed
11	in prior sessions. It hasn't hadn't gotten any
12	traction, and so, it's really cleanup; it's not
13	substantive language. We have provided that to
14	the to the Senate staff. And I believe part of
15	it's already in drafting.
16	Briefly, it it really seeks just to conform
17	the Florida Statutes to what is the actuality on
18	the ground of things like minimum eligibility
19	requirements that are out of sync with federal law
20	and also to clean up what the current
21	responsibilities of each of the agencies that are
22	involved; for example, OPC, in this case, the
23	Commission as well, Department of Education.
24	There are responsibilities that have that
25	have gone away, but that are still reflected in

1	state law. So, in a in a our suggestion has
2	been since 2016, I believe is to clean up the
3	statute as as as happens, as a matter of
4	course, but like I said, that hasn't really met
5	with any success, but at the request of Senate
6	subcommittee staff, we're cooperating with them.
7	Again, part of that, just in full disclosure,
8	is we'd be trying to help with a sponsor on the
9	on the House side. Normally, we wouldn't do this
10	but for cooperating with our legislative committee
11	staff.
12	I had a meeting and the legislative team
13	we had a meeting with the advisors and answered
14	their questions. If you have questions now, we've
15	provided your offices with the draft language
16	that's already in possession at the Senate
17	subcommittee, Senate staff, with with the
18	type-and-strike. So, if you've got questions on
19	that, I'd be happy to answer or Kaley.
20	CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. I I had a
21	chance to look over it. It looks very, very
22	simple. It seems to me there's not a controversial
23	issue in the whole thing.
24	I think it did it passed the Senate two

years ago, didn't it?

2	session that it passed the Senate, but it didn't
3	make it to the to the House or it ran out of
4	time.
5	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Our discussions, i think,

8	staff to work to find someone that could help us
9	maybe on the House side to maybe with some
10	Commissioner's help find someone who could help
11	be a sponsor on the House side to get this
12	approved, get the language through.
13	Anybody have any questions on the proposal?

17	And the last thing, I just wanted to kick over
18	to Kaley for for to the update as to as to
19	the coming session.
