**CRITICAL INFORMATION:** Please place on the September 12, 2023 Internal Affairs.

**Commission approval is sought**

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Pursuant to Section 120.74(1), Florida Statutes (F.S.), the Commission must prepare a regulatory plan by October 1 of each year. The plan must include a listing of each law enacted or amended during the previous 12 months that creates or modifies the duties or authority of the agency. The Commission must also include a listing of each statute which the Commission expects to implement by rulemaking before July 1, 2024, and must include any update to the 2022 Regulatory Plan. The plan must also include a certification verifying that the persons executing the certification have reviewed the plan and that the agency regularly reviews its rules to determine consistency with the agency's rulemaking authority and the laws implemented.

Section 120.74(2), F.S., requires that by October 1 of each year, the regulatory plan must be published on the Commission's website and electronically delivered to the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee (JAPC). Also by October 1, the Commission must publish a notice in the Florida Administrative Register that gives the date the Regulatory Plan was published on the Commission's website.

In order to comply with the statutory October 1, 2023 deadline, staff is seeking Commission approval of the 2023 Regulatory Plan at the September 12, 2023 Internal Affairs. The transmittal letter to JAPC contains the certification required by Section 120.74(1)(d), F.S. The list of laws that create or modify the Commission's duties or authority is attached to the certification letter as Attachment A. Attachment B to the certification letter is the Commission's list of laws that it expects to implement through rule adoption, amendment, or repeal before July 1, 2024. The Commission's report that it has no laws or updates to the 2022 Regulatory Plan is Attachment C to the certification letter.

Dear Mr. Plante:

The Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) hereby files its 2023 Regulatory Plan pursuant to Section 120.74, Florida Statutes (F.S.).

Section 120.74(1)(a), F.S., requires a listing of each law enacted or amended during the previous 12 months which creates or modifies the duties or authority of the agency. For each law listed under paragraph (a), the plan must state whether rule adoption is required to implement the law, and if so, whether a notice of rule development has been published and the date by which the agency expects to publish the notice of proposed rule. The Commission's report of laws pursuant to Section 120.74(1)(a), F.S., is attached hereto as Attachment A.

Section 120.74(1)(b), F.S., states that the regulatory plan must also include a listing of each law not listed pursuant to Section 120.74(1)(a), F.S., that the agency expects to implement by rulemaking before the following July 1. For each law listed under paragraph (b), the plan must state whether the rulemaking is intended to simplify, clarify, increase efficiency, improve coordination with other agencies, reduce costs, or delete obsolete, unnecessary, or redundant rules. The Commission's report of laws pursuant to Section 120.74(1)(b), F.S., is attached hereto as Attachment B.

Section 120.74(1)(c), F.S., requires an identification and listing of laws that were previously identified in a prior year's regulatory plan as requiring rulemaking to implement, but for which a notice of proposed rule has not been published. The Commission has no laws or

2 CHAIRMAN FAY: All right. I just ask everyone

17 of each year. A certification by the Chairman and  
18 the General Counsel that they have reviewed the  
19 plan, and that the Commission regularly reviews its  
20 rules for correctness is required. The plan must  
21 be posted on the Commission website, and the  
22 certification submitted to the Joint Administrative  
23 Procedures Committee by October 1st, 2023.

24 We plan to work with the Chairman's office to  
25 submit the certification letter to the Joint

1 Administrative Procedures Committee, and ask for  
2 administrative authority to correct any scrivener's  
3 errors as necessary before posting the plan.

4 Staff is available to answer any questions.

5 CHAIRMAN FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you, Mr.  
6 Sunshine.

7 With that, Commissioners, we have a summary on  
8 the regulatory plan. We can take up a motion for  
9 approval that would allow administrative authority  
10 for our staff to correct anything needed.

11 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Move approval, Mr.  
12 Chairman.

13 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Second.

14 CHAIRMAN FAY: Okay. We have a motion and a  
15 second.

16 All that approve say aye.

17 (Chorus of ayes.)

18 CHAIRMAN FAY: Okay. Showing unanimous  
19 approval, Mr. Sunshine, we approve the regulatory  
20 plan for submission. Thank you.

21 MR. SUNSHINE: Thank you.

22 CHAIRMAN FAY: All right. Commissioners, next  
23 we will move into our second agenda item for  
24 Internal Affairs, General Counsel's report.

25 MR. HETRICK: Just real quickly, Mr. Chair. I

1 would like to introduce two new attorneys that  
2 recently joined us, Caroline Dike, if she could  
3 stand up, and Carlos Marquez. Carlos is in Adria's  
4 section. Caroline is in Samantha's section, the  
5 appeals section. They both have wonderful  
6 backgrounds they bring to the Commission.

7 Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN FAY: Great. Thank you.

9 And thank you both to joining our team. I  
10 read your resumes, and you are extremely qualified,  
11 and excited to have you on the team. And you will  
12 be up here before you know it. It's very exciting,  
13 so thank you again.

14 Anything else, Mr. Hetrick? Is that it?

15 MR. HETRICK: That's it, Mr. Chair.

16 CHAIRMAN FAY: Okay. With that, we will move  
17 on to the Executive Director's report, Mr. Baez.

18 MR. BAEZ: Thank you, Chairman Fay. We have  
19 no report today.

20 CHAIRMAN FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you.

21 Commissioners, I will take up any other  
22 matters for Internal Affairs.

23 Seeing none. That will conclude our Internal  
24 Affairs meeting for this morning. Next we will  
25 move to our 10-year Site Plan, which we will begin

1 at 10:05. Thank you.
