<u>Issue 1:</u> Should the Commission approve the contract option to extend the Sprint Relay contract for one year beginning June 1, 2011?

**Recommendation:** Yes. Staff recommends that the Commission approve the contract option to extend the Sprint Relay contract for one year beginning June 1, 2011. Rates for traditional telecommunications relay service (TRS) should be \$0.89 per session minute and the rate for CapTel captioning service should be \$1.54 per session minute for the 2011-2012 contract year. Staff also recommends that the amount of the Sprint performance bond should be \$4,582,763 for the 2011-2012 contract option year.

**Issue 2:** Should this docket be closed?

**Recommendation:** No. This docket should remain open for the duration of the contract period with Sprint as the relay provider. This docket is used to monitor relay and contract issues that arise during the contract term.
