<u>ISSUE 1</u>: Should Service Management Systems, Inc.'s (SMS) request for a new class of service for common area bulk irrigation be approved?

RECOMMENDATION: Yes. SMS's request for a new class of service for common area bulk irrigation should be approved. The utility should be allowed to charge the recommended rate as specified in the analysis portion of staff's December 26, 2002 memorandum. The utility should file a new tariff sheet which is consistent with the Commission's vote within 30 days of issuance of the Consummating Order. Staff should approve the tariff sheet upon verification that the tariff is consistent with the Commission's decision. If the new tariff sheet is filed and approved, the common area bulk irrigation rate should become effective on or after the stamped approval date of the tariff sheet, if no protest is filed.
