

## Commissioner Ronald A. Brisé Honored for Public Service

After serving two terms as a Florida Public Service Commissioner, Ronald A. Brise's last day as a PSC Commissioner is January 1, 2018. His colleagues at the Commission and at the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) praised his record of fair and thoughtful public service and expressed regret at his departure.
