# COMMENTS OF THE SOUTHEASTERN ASSOCIATION OF REGULATORY UTILITY COMMISSIONERS (SEARUC)

#### **OCTOBER 2001**

The Southeastern Association of Regulatory Commissioners (SEARUC) believe that good policy decisions are made after careful research and analysis of pertinent facts from direct experience. It is important to have an in-depth understanding of the current status of generation, transmission flows, trading patterns, and load growth projections before any meaningful cost-benefit analysis can be performed in arriving at policy decisions regarding transmission. We regret that FERC has not chosen to perform such an analysis before setting the course for a single, large RTO for the Southeast. However, the Southeastern Commissioners believe such an analysis is critical to good policy decisions. In as much as the aggregate experience of the SEARUC commissioners is significant and applicable to the markets in the Southeast, we are conducting our own analysis. We respectfully ask FERC to delay any further proceeding on a Southeastern RTO until such time as we have completed our study, which will be performed in a timely manner.<sup>1</sup>
