

Application for increase in water and wastewater rates in Sumter County by

Jumper Creek Utility Company

DOCKET NO. 20180217-WS

On November 26, 2018, Jumper Creek Utility Company (Jumper Creek) filed an application with the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC or Commission) for an increase in water and wastewater rates. Jumper Creek provides water and wastewater service to approximately 50 residential customers in Sumter County.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

1 Is there an opportunity for public input on this rate case?

Yes. As part of the evaluation process for Jumper Creek's rate request, the Commission staff will conduct a customer meeting to allow feedback about Jumper Creek and the rate-setting process. Comments will be reviewed before the Commission reaches a decision. One or more Commissioners may attend and participate during the customer meeting.

2 Why is Jumper Creek requesting a rate increase?

Jumper Creek is requesting a rate increase in order to recover the cost of operating the utility and allow the company the opportunity to earn a fair rate of return on its investment.

3 When was Jumper Creek's last approved rate increase?

Jumper Creek's last approved rate increase was in 2015.

4 How much is the current monthly water and wastewater bill for a residential customer of Jumper Creek using 3,000 gallons?

The utility's current monthly water and wastewater bill for a residential customer using 3,000 gallons is \$38.58 and \$54.67, respectively.

5 Using the utility's proposed rates, how much would the monthly water and wastewater bill be for a residential customer of Jumper Creek using 3,000 gallons?

Using the utility's proposed rates, the monthly water and wastewater bill for a residential customer using 3,000 gallons would be \$46.28 and \$60.41, respectively.

6 What if I cannot attend the customer meeting or prefer not to speak? Are there other ways to comment on this case?
