Application for increase in water and wastewater rates in Manatee County by

Heather Hills Utilities, LLC

DOCKET NO. 20190113-WS

On May 9, 2019, Heather Hills Utilities, LLC (Heather Hills) filed an application with the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC or Commission) for an increase in water and wastewater rates. Heather Hills provides water and wastewater service to approximately 350 residential customers and 1 general service customer in Manatee County.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

1 Is there an opportunity for public input on this rate case?

Yes. As part of the evaluation process for Heather Hills' rate request, the Commission staff will conduct a customer meeting to allow feedback about Heather Hills and the rate-setting process. Comments will be reviewed before the Commission reaches a decision. One or more Commissioners may attend and participate during the customer meeting.

2 Why is Heather Hills requesting a rate increase?

Heather Hills is requesting a rate increase to recover the cost of operating the utility and allow the company an opportunity to earn a fair rate of return on its investment.

When was Heather Hills' last approved rate increase?

Heather Hills' last approved rate increase was in 2010.

4 How much is the current quarterly water and wastewater bills for a residential customer of Heather Hills using 5,000 gallons?

The utility's current quarterly water and wastewater bill for a residential customer using 5,000 gallons is \$45.56 and \$75.82, respectively.

5 Using staff's recommended rates, how much would the quarterly water and wastewater bill be for a residential customer of Heather Hills using 5,000 gallons?

Using staff's recommended rates, the quarterly water and wastewater bill for a residential customer using 5,000 gallons would be \$57.06 and \$89.79, respectively.

6 What if I cannot attend the customer meeting or prefer not to speak? Are there other ways to comment on this case?
