Application for a limited alternative rate increase in Polk County by

Pinecrest Utilities, LLC

DOCKET NO. 20200152-WS

On May 28, 2020, Pinecrest Utilities, LLC (Pinecrest or Utility) filed an application with the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC or Commission) for a limited alternative rate increase. Pinecrest provides water service to 142 customers in Polk County.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

1 Why is Pinecrest requesting a rate increase?

Pinecrest is requesting a rate increase to recover its share of increased common costs (such as office expense, salaries, and insurance) payable to its service company, FUS1. In addition, Pinecrest also seeks to recover its share of the costs for a new Compliance Technician position.

2 When was Pinecrest's last approved rate increase?

Pinecrest's rates for water were last approved by the Commission in a staff-assisted rate case in 2013.

How much is the current monthly water bill for a residential customer of Pinecrest using 5,000 gallons?

The Utility's current monthly water bill for a residential customer using 5,000 gallons is \$41.01.

4 Using the Utility's proposed rates, how much would the monthly water bill be for a residential customer of Pinecrest using 5,000 gallons?

Using the Utility's proposed rates, the monthly water bill for a residential customer using 5,000 gallons would be \$42.94.

5 What if I wish to provide input on the proposed rate increase?
