

# Florida Public Service Commission RATE CASE OVERVIEW

#### May 2023

Application for a limited alternative rate increase in Hardee County by

#### Charlie Creek Utilities, LLC

**DOCKET NO. 20220185-WS** 

On November 7, 2022, Charlie Creek Utilities, LLC (Charlie Creek or Utility) filed an application for a limited alternative rate increase (LARI) to recover the incremental increase in operating costs over the amount approved in the utility's last rate proceeding. Charlie Creek is a Class C utility providing water service to 165 residential and one general service customer in Hardee County. The utility is operated under Florida Utility Services 1, LLC (FUS1), a service company.

#### Questions & Answers

#### **◆** Why is Charlie Creek requesting a rate increase?

Charlie Creek is requesting a rate increase to recover the incremental increase in operating costs over the amount approved in the utility's last rate proceeding.

## **2** When was Charlie Creek's last approved rate increase?

Charlie Creek's last rate case was approved in 2017. However, the utility has had four price index price adjustments.

# 4 How much is the current and proposed monthly water bill for a Charlie Creek residential customer using 4,000 gallons?

The current monthly water bill for a Charlie Creek residential customer using 4,000 gallons is \$35.02. The proposed monthly water bill would be \$42.03.
