Application for a limited alternative rate increase in Pasco County by

### Crestridge Utilities, LLC DOCKET NO. 20220185-WS

On November 7, 2022, Crestridge Utilities, LLC. (Crestridge or Utility) filed an application for a limited alternative rate increase (LARI) to recover the incremental increase in operating costs over the amount approved in the utility's last rate proceeding. Crestridge is a Class C water utility serving 619 customers in Pasco County. The utility is operated under Florida Utility Services 1, LLC (FUS1), a service company.

Crestridge is requesting a rate increase to recover the incremental increase in operating costs over the amount approved in the utility's last rate proceeding.
