On November 7, 2022, Orange Land Utilities, LLC (OLU) filed an application for a limited alternative rate increase (LARI) to recover the incremental increase in operating costs over the amount approved in the utility's last rate proceeding. OLU is a Class C water utility providing service in Pasco County to 72 residential customers and 1 general service customer. The City of Lakeland provides water service to the customers. The utility is operated under Florida Utility Services 1, LLC (FUS1), a service company.
