



# Florida Public Service Commission RATE CASE OVERVIEW

JANUARY 2026

Application for staff-assisted rate case in Orange County by  
**Gulfstream Utility LLC**

DOCKET NO. 20250084-SU

On June 4, 2025 Gulfstream Utility LLC (Gulfstream) filed an application with the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission or FPSC) for a staff-assisted rate case. Gulfstream provides wastewater service to 965 residential customers in Orange County. Water service is provided by the Utility through a bulk service agreement with Orange County.

## QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

### **1. Why is Gulfstream requesting a rate increase?**

Gulfstream is requesting a rate increase to recover the cost of operating the Utility and allow the company an opportunity to earn a fair rate of return on its investment.

### **2. When was Gulfstream's last approved rate case?**

This is Gulfstream's first rate increase request since it received its original certificate in 2022.

### **3. Is there an opportunity for public input on this rate case?**

Yes. As part of the evaluation process of Gulfstream's request, Commission staff will conduct a virtual customer meeting to allow feedback about Gulfstream's quality of service and the rate setting process. Comments will be reviewed before the Commission reaches a decision. One or more Commissioners may attend and participate during the customer meeting.

Registration will be available beginning December 30, 2025 at 9 a.m. EDT, and close at noon on January 9, 2026. Please note that the order in which customers will speak is based on the order in which they register. If you have questions about the sign-up process, please call (850) 413-7080. One day prior to the meeting, customers who signed up to speak will be provided further instructions from FPSC staff on how to participate.

All customers who register to present comments at the meeting are urged to call in promptly at the scheduled meeting time, because the meeting may be adjourned early if no customers are present.

### **6. How much is the current monthly wastewater bill for a residential customer of Gulfstream using 3,000 gallons?**

The current monthly wastewater bill for a residential customer of Gulfstream using 3,000 gallons is \$17.17.

### **7. How much would the monthly wastewater bill be for a residential customer of Gulfstream using 3,000 gallons?**

The monthly bill for a residential customer of Gulfstream using 3,000 gallons at the proposed rate would be \$26.74.

### **9. Who provides legal representation for customers in utility related matters before the FPSC?**

FPSC staff is scheduled to file a recommendation with the Commission on March 19, 2026. The Commissioners are expected to vote on the recommendation at the April 7, 2026 Commission Conference.
