- 375,000 total customers
- Second largest municipal utility in Florida
- 14<sup>th</sup> largest in nation
- Generation capacity of 1,946 Megawatts



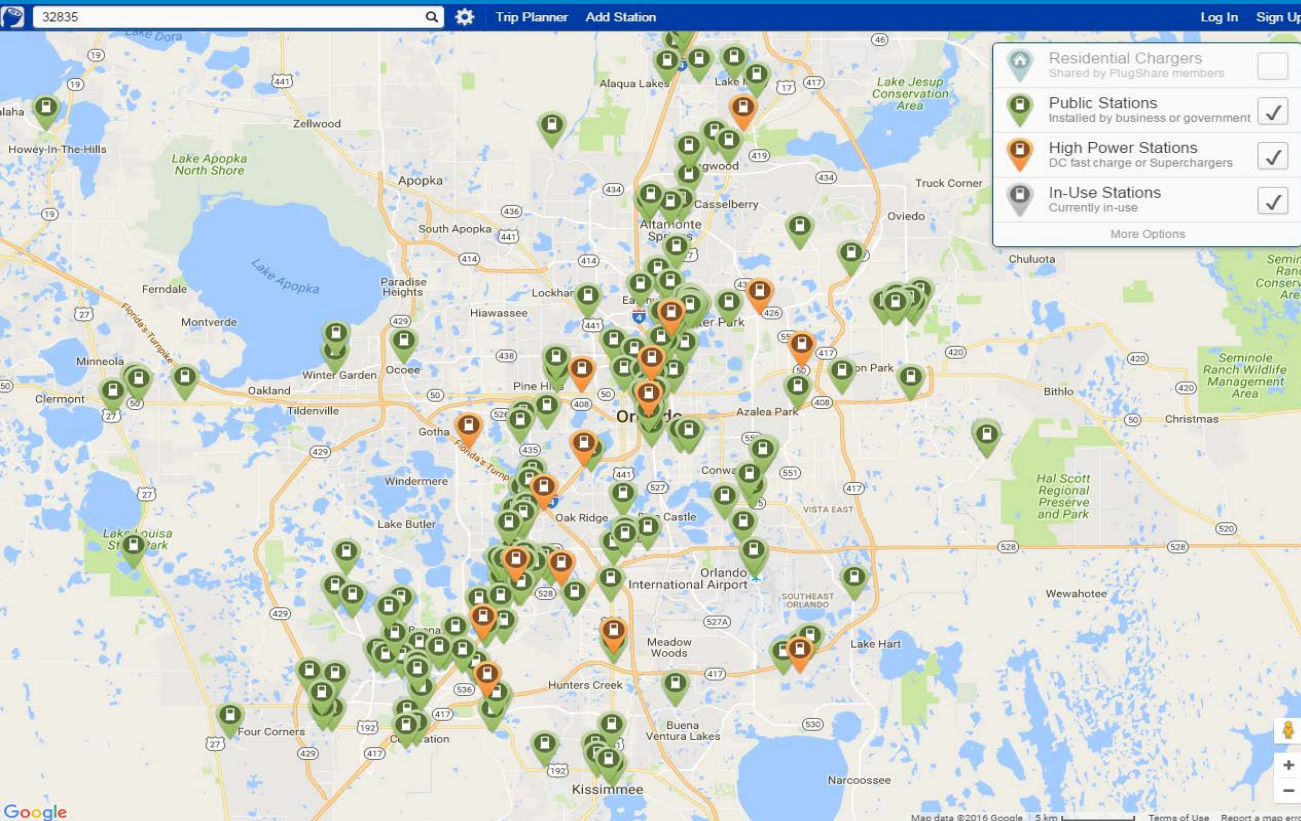
# OUC Service Territory

- 200-square-mile water service area

# Orlando Area EV Charging Infrastructure



- Over 200 EV charging stations in Greater Orlando area
- OUC installed over 150 public chargers
  - 5 of which are DCQC
- Leveraged ARRA, ChargePoint Grant

# OUC EV Programs and Incentives



- **Own It – Charge It: Commercial EV Charging Services, to launch soon**
  - Offerings:
    - Level 2 chargers
    - DC Quick Chargers
  - Purchase options:
    - Leasing – OUC owns, operates and maintains equipment
    - Turnkey – OUC procures and installs equipment for customer
- **Rebates**
  - \$200 charging station rebate for businesses and multifamily
  - \$200 rebate for customer purchase or lease of a plug-in EV



# Future of OUC EV Charging



- Where and when to charge EV's? Who decides?
  - Home: overnight
  - Work: during the day
  - “Around town” (retail, restaurant, dentist, city parking space, etc): when it's convenient
  - Major travel arteries: when it's needed
  - Destinations (airport, hotel, theme park): when it's convenient
- Need a clear business case for EV charging location owners
  - We could not “give” them away
- Rate designs that incent EV ownership
  - How to incent plug-in's versus hybrids?
  - Time of use rates to drive overnight charging
- The right business model for the Utility?
- Batteries and other technologies are changing the EV landscape
