Link-Up Florida provides a 50% reduction in the telephone service hook-up charge, up to a maximum of \$30.00.

You may be eligible for savings if you receive benefits under one of these programs:

- ♦ Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Medicaid
- Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
- ♦ Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8)
- Food Stamps
- ♦ National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Free Lunch
 - Bureau of Indian Affairs Programs
- ◆ Tribal Temporary assistance for Needy Families
 ◆ Head Start Subsidy
 ◆ National School Lunch Program (NSLP)

If you are at or below 135% of the poverty level, but not currently receiving benefits from one of the listed programs, you may be able to qualify by contacting the Office of Public Counsel in Tallahassee at 1-800-540-7039.
