You may be eligible for savings if you receive benefits under one of these programs:

- ◆ Supplemental Security Income (SSI) ◆ Medicaid
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8)
 - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
 - Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
 - Bureau of Indian Affairs Programs
- ◆ Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families ◆ Head Start Subsidy
 - ◆ National School Lunch Program (NSLP)

If you are at or below 135% of the poverty level, but not currently receiving benefits from one of the listed programs, you may be able to qualify by contacting the Office of Public Counsel in Tallahassee at 1-800-540-7039.

Some wireless and competitive local exchange companies (CLECs) also offer the Lifeline Assistance program.
